

Did You Know_

"Wintertime Blues" Happens To Many......Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD)

Symptoms:

Depression
Anxiety
Mood Changes
Sleep Problems
Lethargy
Overeating
Social Problems

Sexual Problems

Causes: The reduced level of sunlight in the fall and winter months may affect an individual's serotonin, a neurotransmitter that affects mood. Lower levels of serotonin have been shown to be linked to depression.

Melatonin, a sleep-related hormone secreted by the pineal gland in the brain, has been liniked to seasonal depression.

Prevention: Seasonal depression has a predictable pattern of recurrence, preventative measures may help to reduce symptoms. Begin light therapy in early fall before onset of symptoms, exercise more, increase the light in your home, meditation and other stress management techniques, spend time outside.

Treatments:

Phototherapy or bright light therapy has been shown to suppress the brain's secretion of melatonin

An Antidepressant drug may be effective in reducing or eliminating symptoms





She helped raise three generations of her family: her own 3 children plus adopted son, Steven; grandkids Corey, Kelsie, Natalie; and great grands Roni, Kaleo, and Harris. Mary Ann appreciated so many of the simple things in life—family reunions, pets, good food, campouts, country music and ELVIS!

She was preceded in death by her parents Don and Maxine Brummer, her oldest brother Dennis, her son Donnie, daughter Diane, and daughter-in-law Nancy.

She is survived by her devoted husband Ken, children Glen, and Steven; Glen's children: Alexis, Mark, Christopher, Kellie, and Natalie and her husband Alex Strandgard, and their son Harris; Diane's children: Kelsie, Corey and his wife Heather and her children Hunter and Johnathan; Steven and children Emberlyn and Benjamin; her brother Jerry Brummer and his wife Eloise and their children: Colin and his wife Fara and granddaughters Grace and Faith; and daughter Kitsi (Brummer) Bass and husband Michael and their children: Lyndi, Annie, Katie, James and Jacob.
